Information & Reports

A. Report: Goals Committee – Section D

The Goals Committee – Section D (J. Owen – Chair, Alcorn (Co-Chair), Reidzans, Sellers, Patin, Morrow, Lanser, Gentile, Sherman), shared an update on their goal progress:

Board Goal #4

Create educational opportunities for all K-12 students with a focus on STEM activities to help grow the STEM curriculum district-wide to match or enhance the curriculum at the high school.

Desired Results: Provide Kelloggsville students enhanced educational opportunities with a focus on STEM curriculum and activities. Have organic growth district-wide that will raise awareness of our new STEM addition at the high school.

Instructional Goal #6

Enhance STEM programming at all levels.

Desired Results: Increase the number of students becoming involved in STEM opportunities before reaching Kelloggsville High School so the STEM addition will be fully utilized. There will be specific focus on the newly added Computer Science Courses at KHS and KMS.

Operations Goal #2

Monitor the KHS STEM addition and conclusion of Southeast Media Center.

Desired Results: Successful completion of both projects.

For BOE Goal #4 and Instructional Goal #6, Mr. Owen shared current initiatives that involve STEM activities throughout the district. At Central, a 3rd – 5th grade Lego Robotics Club will be starting, with a nice set of Lego materials purchased for students to use. He added that at this time, the K-2nd grade levels are lacking any related programs, as it is a challenge to find staff that are comfortable in this type of instruction. Coding on Wheels, is an after-school program at the middle school level where students interact with an outside organization that provide a hands-on environment with activities in technology and STEM. In addition, Computer Science courses and Robotics have been added at all MS grade levels.

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Currently, Intro to Computer Science, Robotics 1 and a Robotics Team are available to students at the HS level and the district has applied to TEALS for additional section(s) of Intro to Computer Science and Robotics 2. Upcoming Professional Development will include planning and developing a cohesive and alignment of plans by all of the district's STEM teachers and representatives from KISD, GVSU and MiSTEM Network. For Operations Goal #2, he shared that the new Southeast Media Center is complete and operational for staff and students to use, the new STEM addition at KHS was completed as scheduled, and students are accessing the space as of 01/08/24, with minor items still needing to be completed. The committee will present their next report on 03/11/24.

B. Report: Instructional Goals Committee – Goal #5

The Instructional Goals #5 Committee (J. Owen – Chair, Schilthuis (Co-Chair), Taylor, Caterino, Hallo, Farkas, Fountaine, Sherman, Patin, Lathrop, Tanis, Sellers, Reidzans), shared an update on their goal progress:

Instruction Goal #5

Monitor the Alternative Education Program (54th Street Academy) and Online (Kelloggsville Virtual School) programming.

Desired Results: Look to see if there are opportunities to combine the programs while reducing the overall costs, but still provide students with a quality virtual education experience.

Mr. Owen shared that the committee has met and been provided with the current structure and details of both programs by Mrs. Sherman and Mrs. Taylor. A cost analysis on the KVS program has also taken place and it was determined that if the program were to continue as it is currently structured, it would run \$200,000 to the red. Further consideration will need to be researched if resources from both programs can efficiently be combined. The committee will break into subcommittees to look at considering different ways that the programs could be combined, in addition to sharing an administrator, adding that with Mrs. Taylors' retirement announcement that is effective 01/31/24 will result in Mrs. Sherman covering both programs. The committee will look at other staffing options in both programs and review how to best move forward by reducing costs but keep two (2) quality programs for next school year. The committee will present their next report on 03/11/24.

OTHER MATTERS

- Mr. Alston thanked the Board for all of their many years of service and exceptional leadership that they provide to the Kelloggsville District. It is not an easy task but their efforts are very much appreciated and do not go unnoticed.
- He extended congratulations to Mrs. Taylor on her retirement announcement and thanked her for her many years of service to the students at KPS. She will be missed but he wished her well in her future endeavors.
- He also shared that the new STEM addition at KHS is up and running and it is great to see students in that space and exciting to see what endless possibilities it will provide to our students and community.
