B. Security Cameras and Secured Entrances

Mr. Hoorn presented a proposal as part of the Operations Committee – Goal #2; Improve safety and security of all buildings through improved camera coverage and/or increased electronic entrances. Desired Results: Provide safe and secure entrances and hallways at all district buildings. His proposal included two aspects; access controls and additional security cameras. Upgrades to the current access controls system at the middle school includes added controls at the north bus doorway and east hall doorway, along with upgrades to the staff entrance door. Upgrades at West Elementary include installation of a new control access system, secure vestibule doors and the West + South doorways. In addition, the proposal includes added security cameras for additional outside coverage and added hallway and interior exit cameras. He shared that the remaining district buildings will receive similar upgrades to secure entrances when renovations start in the spring/summer of 2023. Targeted locations for next summer's renovated entrances include the Administration Office, KECLC, 54th Street and Southeast Elementary. The cost for the access controls and additional security cameras for the middle school and West are through the REMC bidding contract at a cost of \$41,367 (West Elementary) and \$21,613 (Middle School) = \$62,980 total. This proposal will be placed on the 10/10/22 agenda as a consent item.

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INFORMATION & REPORTS

A. Art Travelers Trip

Ms. Dahlquist and Ms. Pomorski shared their travel experiences with students from KHS that took part with the Art Travelers group to Greece this past summer. 14 students, along with adult parent chaperones experienced a guided tour through some of Greece's most famous cultural and historical destinations, along with a cruise of the islands that followed. Rachel Muzamhindo, KHS 10th grader, shared her experiences and adventures with the Board, adding that she developed friendships with many other travelers she met from other parts of the world and had an amazing time. It was noted that even with some unexpected COVID and travel difficulties, the students from Kelloggsville did an outstanding job of learning to go with the flow and learned some valuable life lessons while enjoying this once in a lifetime travel experience. The Board shared appreciation to Ms. Dahlquist and Ms. Pomorski for their leadership and for providing this learning opportunity to our Kelloggsville students.

B. Summer Facilities Projects

Mr. Skinner presented an update on the list of projects that were completed over the summer throughout the district. He thanked Denny Ricketson who assisted by overseeing the crews that were responsible for cleaning the buildings so that Mr. Skinner could attend to other projects that were simultaneously taking place such as; new roofing upgrades at KMS, continued construction of the baseball & softball sports plaza, irrigation and fencing throughout the district, and other various projects. He added that 90% of the summer work orders were completed along with some extra addons, making this a very successful summer of project completions.

She shared that she is very pleased on how fantastic the new sports facilities look. She also promoted the Region 3 Legislative Priority Setting Meeting taking place at
