Kelloggsville Staff Recognized by Govern Whitmer for Heroic Acts

> On Tuesday, October 4th, three staff members helped rescue a two-year-old after he was left on the side of the road after the car he was in was stolen.

Sue Figueroa was driving her first-morning route when she noticed a small child on the side of the road. At the same time, Dave Skinner (Director of Building and Grounds) was also starting his first bus driving route of the morning when a frantic woman and man waved him down. The woman just had her car stolen with her two-year-old in the car.

In the next few minutes, Mr. Skinner contacted the Kentwood Police and communicated about the situation with all bus drivers and Kristin Nickelson, Director of Transportation. Ms. Figueroa turned her bus around to pick up the young child as she believed the child to be the one that was missing. She reunited the child with their mother within a few minutes.

Our staff was recognized by local news for a few days before this story was picked up by national news! Network ABC News has picked this story up, network NBC News, the Today Show, Good Morning America, Inside Edition, and many digital news outlets.

On Monday, October 10th, all three staff members were recognized by our Board of Education and by Nate Engle, the West Michigan Regional Liaison of the Executive Office of Governor Gretchen Whitmer. Governor Whitmer honored all three with certificates of recognition for their heroic acts. Thank you, Sue, Dave, and Kristin!
