When the window opens for completing and filing the FAFSA, we will hold multiple FAFSA nights at the high school to help students & parents with the process. This will be sometime in January – stay tuned for more information.

Just a heads up – items you will want to bring to the FAFSA meeting:

- 1. FAFSA Login and password for student and/or parent (the login and password you use to create the FSA ID).
- 2. 2024-25 FAFSA will be based on taxes filed in 2022.
- 3. W2 forms for parent & student.
- 4. Social Security number for student.
- 5. Driver's license for student if they have one.
- 6. Current info on private business, investments and or/or farm.
- 7. Current bank statement information (accounts and balances).

Every senior is welcome who wants to pursue financial aid for college/trade schools/job training programs.

\*\*Students need to know their Social Security or Alien Registration number to apply. Parents do not need to submit those to fill out the FAFSA.

#### **Paying for College**

Complete the FAFSA as soon as it opens if there is a plan or consideration to attend college or job training program after graduation. An alternative to using the government site for the FAFSA is *Going Merry*, an easier site with simpler language, more tips, available help and overall easier process to complete the FAFSA. GoingMerry is also a scholarship matching site with many scholarships bundled into one application.

Enroll at <u>www.goingmerry.com</u> to create an account to complete the FAFSA.

Khan Academy - Do you feel your child could benefit from a little extra help? Khan Academy offers practice exercises, instructional videos, and a personalized learning dashboard that empower learners to study at their own pace. It draws personalized information from the students' PSAT tests through its connection to College Board, and delivers instruction targeted at deficit areas.
