First Day of School

Bikes/Scooters:

If your child rides a bike/scooter to school, they need to secure their bike/scooter to the bike rack with a chain and lock. Each bike/scooter should have its own lock. Students who choose to bring their bikes/scooters to school assume full responsibility. The school cannot be held liable for the loss of any bike/scooter.

Lockers:

Lockers are the property of the school. They are assigned to you for your convenience and for purposes of storing supplies, purses, coats, and other items essential for the formal educational process. Periodic locker checks are designed for the purpose of ensuring school safety and student welfare. These lockers will be inspected according to legal guidelines. At the beginning of the school year, you will be issued your own locker with a combination lock. You must use your own locker. DO NOT SHARE. You are responsible for your own locker inside and out. Coats, phones, and book bags are to be put in your locker. No coats, purses, phones, or book bags are allowed in class. Students may only decorate their locker with magnetic items. Stickers or tape will not be allowed.

Dress Code:

Student dress is primarily the responsibility of the student and their parent or guardian. However, the building administrators reserve the right to send a student home whose clothing is a disruption to the educational program. All sleeveless shirts must have a strap width of three fingers to be acceptable. See-

through tops, shirts that represent gang colors, as well as shirts with sayings or pictures concerning alcohol, drugs, or sexual content are not acceptable. Head coverings of any kind are not permitted in school. Dresses, skirts, or shorts must be at least fingertip length. NO outdoor vests, “shorty tops”, or exposed undergarments will be permitted. Sagging pants will not be tolerated. Skin tight clothing is inappropriate for school, leggings and yoga pants can be worn as long as they are covered with a dress, skirt, shorts, or top that is long enough to cover their behind (front and back). If a student continually has a problem with dress code infractions, they will be referred to the building administrator for further disciplinary action.

Telephone Usage:

Students are **not** allowed to use cell phones between 8:00 and 3:00. In addition, students will be required to keep all cell phones in their locker. There is a student telephone in the main office. This telephone is to be used for emergency school-related business only. Students may use the phone before and/or after school. If a student is ill, they will be sent to the office to call home.

Medication:

If your student needs to take medication at school, a Medication Administration form must be completed and signed by a parent/guardian. Medication Administration forms are available in the Main Office. If your student needs to take a non-prescription medication, it must be supplied by the parent/guardian. If your student needs to take a prescription medication, the Medication Administration form must be signed by a physician in addition to the parents/guardians signature. All prescription medications will also be kept and dispensed in the Main Office. Please do not send medications to school with your student, all medications must be checked into the Main Office by a parent/guardian.
